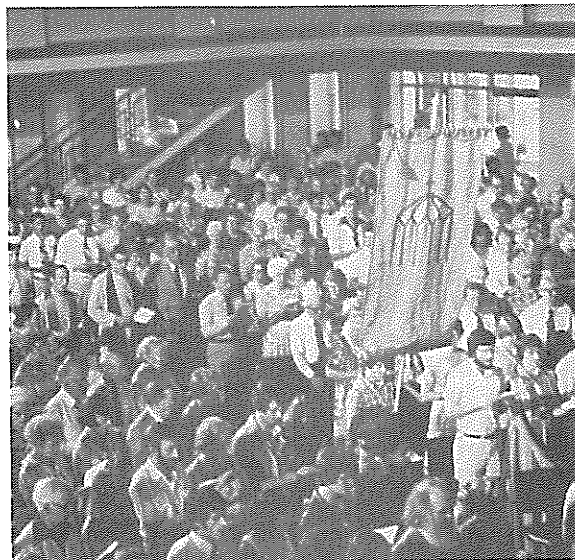

A PLACE FOR YOU



TO WORSHIP

The first worshipping congregation of Maughan Church began in 1862. The present building was dedicated in 1965.

Today three different styles of worship each Sunday cater for individual preferences.

- A service for people of all ages is held at 9.30 a.m. Members plan and conduct the worship which features congregational participation.
- Morning worship at eleven is a family activity with members of the congregation sharing in the conduct of worship. A creche is available.
- "Good News" — the Sunday evening broadcast at seven to a vast radio congregation through stations 5KA-5AU-5RM as well as the "live" congregation gathered in Maughan Church.

Holy communion is celebrated on the first Sunday evening and the third Sunday morning of each month.

Baptism, by arrangement with the ministers, is on the first Sunday morning of each month.

A PLACE TO LEARN



SUNDAY SCHOOL

Maughan Sunday School caters for toddlers through to young people. A youth group is associated with the Sunday School. Teachers endeavour to relate the learning to the lifestyle, environment and experiences of young people. The Sunday School is constantly evolving in relation to the latest educational methods.

CONFIRMATION COURSES – PASTOR'S CLASSES

Held at regular intervals, these act not only as a preparation for confirmation but also serve those enquiring about the Christian faith and those wishing to do a refresher course. Enquiries should be directed to the ministerial team.

PRE-MARRIAGE COURSES

These are run in conjunction with Pilgrim Church and the Department of Education and Citizenship. They cover the background to the wedding service, the meaning of Christian Marriage, establishing a home, managing money and the art of developing a partnership. The course provides time for small group sharing.

BIBLE STUDIES

At any one time there will be a number of groups for Bible study. These cater for different interests and age groups and are held both at the church and in private homes. Information may be obtained from the ministerial team.



A PLACE TO SHARE

In a large city church a range of fellowship groups helps people to get to know each other outside of worship and study. In addition the "Good News" Broadcast is always followed by the 'After Eight' Programme in Way Hall.

WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP

The group meets on the first Tuesday of each month. Its members take part in devotional, social and fund-raising activities.

DOMINIC'S

This is a club for young people under 35 years. A varied programme includes discussions, speakers, outings and informal evenings. The group meets in Mission House each Friday.

INNER FOLK

Inner Folk meets each Tuesday in the coffee bar of Mission House. It caters for young people between 17 and 25 who may experience some difficulty in mixing socially. Integration into local groups is encouraged.

eM

The Mission-based drama group, eM, began in 1974. It aims to provide a creative outlet for those associated with the Church and Mission. eM's productions raise funds for the work of the Mission. There is also a social group for members. People interested in various aspects of the theatre are invited to join.

SPORTS CLUBS

Cricket and tennis clubs operate at the appropriate seasons.

YOUTH GROUPS

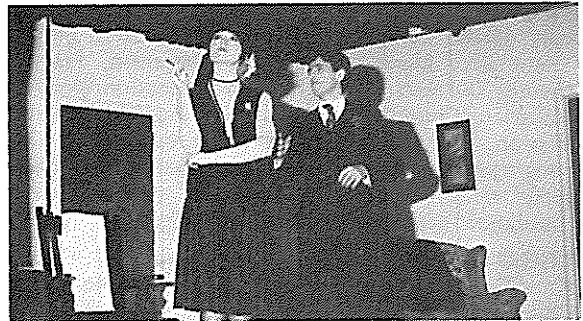
These groups meet fortnightly. The programme includes social, spiritual and service activities.

MEETING POINT

An open fellowship for people who wish to discover the difference that Jesus Christ can make to their lives. The group meets on Tuesday evenings in Way Hall, Mission House.

TOGETHER

The family of the church shares an evening once a month. It includes crafts, music, films, a "pot luck" tea and ample opportunity for fellowship.



A PLACE TO SERVE



THE CHOIRS

Maughan Church is served by a Morning Choir and an Evening Choir under the direction of Colin Curtis and Lewis Dawe respectively.

SNACK BAR

The Snack Bar in the ground floor foyer of Mission House is open on Sundays 12 noon to 1.30 p.m. and 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. Volunteer help is always welcome both in the Snack Bar and at the after-church coffee time.

ELDERS

Members elected by the congregation to share with the Ministers in building up the congregation in faith and love.

STEWARDS

Stewards look after newcomers to church, conduct tours of Mission House, prepare for communion and carry out other functions which are necessary to worship. There are other behind-the-scenes jobs involved in church life, such as flower arranging. These all go to help the smooth running of worship and the outreach of the Church.

SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHING

New teachers are always needed. Parents and members of the congregation are also invited to help on a casual basis in order to encourage the children and share particular skills.

ACTION GROUPS

The various areas of church life are cared for by members of the congregation working in action groups. These are: Membership and Evangelism, Planned Giving, Outreach and Christian Education/Worship. Maughan Church is part of the Adelaide Central Mission. The Mission began as an outreach of the congregation. It provides the largest church-based social welfare agency in Australia, reaching out to thousands through the following services.

CHILD CARE

Kate Cocks Family Services and Lentara Homes for Children. This work is decentralised and offers

residential care in suburban cottage homes, Family Therapy, Foster and Day Care.

AGED CARE

Aldersgate Village at Payneham and the Murray Mudge Settlement at Glenelg provide care and security for over 600 aged people.

REHABILITATION SERVICES

Wright Court — a day centre in the city; Kuitpo Colony — a farm treatment centre; Koster House — a boarding hostel at Kent Town; community houses.

COUNSELLING SERVICES

Lifeline and Youthline, 24 hour telephone counselling. Lifeline also offers personal and marriage counselling as well as a variety of Human Relations groups.

GOODWILL INDUSTRIES

Provides goods for relief and sells second-hand quality items through city, metropolitan and country outlets. A sheltered workshop to employ handicapped workers is being established at Dry Creek.

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN BROADCASTING NETWORK

Radio Station 5KA in the city, and country stations 5AU and 5RM.

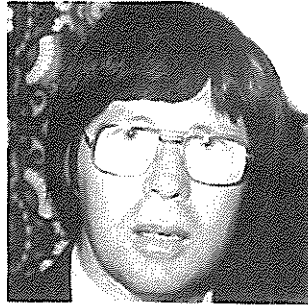
MISSION HOUSE is the base for the ministerial team, and houses the Mission's central administration. This includes Accounting and Public Relations and Promotions. There is also a ~~Day Child Care Centre~~, a Credit Union and a Printing Department — Shaftesbury Press.

VOLUNTEERS make a vital contribution in all areas of Mission activities. No matter what abilities or interests a person possesses, the Mission provides opportunities for service. Enquiries to the Co-ordinator of Volunteers on 212 2599.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES related to the Mission include a **Senior Citizens' Club** which meets on Mondays and Fridays; **Community Centre** providing friendship and fellowship through a wide range of leisure activities each Friday night, and the **Friendship Programme** held each Thursday.
